Summer is a good time to do as Psalm 46 encourages us: *Be still and know that I am God.* Summer activities take us outdoors to enjoy the beautiful creation around us whether in a National Park, a Kentucky State Park, the Bluegrass countryside, a Lexington/Fayette park, the serenity of Second Church’s landscape, or our own backyard. We can encounter and experience God’s presence wherever we are. Jewish theologian and philosopher Abraham Heschel has written the following in his book God in Search of Man.

The secret of every being is the divine care and concern that are invested in it. Something sacred is at stake in every event. Awe is an intuition for the creaturely dignity of all things and their preciousness to God; a realization that things not only are what they are but also stand, however remotely, for something absolute. Awe is a sense for the transcendence, for the reference everywhere to him who is beyond all things. It is an insight better conveyed in attitudes than in words...

Thus summer is a good time to do as Psalm 46 encourages us: *Be still and know that I am God.* Wherever you find yourself in God’s creation, be still, sense the wonder, and have an awe-full (but not awful!) summer.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

For the last three years individuals with IRAs who were required to take distributions from their IRAs (e.g. they were over 70 1/2 years old) were allowed to take the distribution tax-free from their IRAs if they were distributed to charities, such as Second Presbyterian Church. This provision has been extended.

If you have not yet completed your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for 2009 or if you would like to make an additional distribution, you can take advantage of this provision and make a tax-free contribution to the church from your IRA. Like the previous years, since the distribution will not be included in taxable income, individuals will not be able to claim a tax deduction for the contribution.

TRUSTEES CORNER

We wanted to give you an update on several building projects underway or in the planning stages as the summer begins:

- A dropped ceiling, recessed lighting and ceiling fans are being installed in the nursery. This project will also include touch up painting, carpet cleaning and general room refurbishing. Renovations will begin in the next two weeks and are not expected to take very long. Please be patient with our mess in the nursery area during this time. Joann Atcher and her staff are looking forward to sharing the renovation with the congregation.
- Evaluation of how best to upgrade sanctuary lighting continues. On June 4th, members of the Session and Trustees attended a mock-up that demonstrated the effect of an existing chandelier fitted with high efficiency fluorescent bulbs on sanctuary lighting. They were also able to see how up-lighting can enhance architectural details of the ceiling. Jim Potts, Chair of the Maintenance Committee, has requested lighting contractor bids so we will have a better idea of what we can afford. The plan is to reuse existing chandeliers which would be restored to their original antique nickel finish consistent with church architecture and with sanctuary organ pipes.
- The kitchenette in the Education Wing has been renovated! Please stop by and see the new cabinets, countertops and sink. All that is left is the painting. Thank you to Jim Potts and Second's staff for all their hard work putting together a great new area for all to enjoy.

FOR THE HEALTH OF IT



Let the light of Your face shine upon us, O Lord. Psalm 4:6

What's your sun safety IQ? There are some common misunderstandings concerning protection from the sun:

- There are 2 common sunscreen mistakes -- using too little and waiting too long to reapply. Use a palmful of lotion and reapply every 2 hours. You need to reapply even more often if you are swimming or sweating. Don't forget spots like ears and the back of the neck.
- Sunscreen doesn't mean you can stay in the sun for as long as you want. You still aren't getting total protection from UV rays. Limit midday time in the sun, and cover up with a shirt or wear a wide-brimmed hat. And don't forget sunglasses to protect your eyes.
- Getting a "base tan" at a salon will not give you protection against a burn. There is no safe tan! Tanning injures the skin.
- Brief sun exposure all year round can add up to skin damage. For example, driving your car during peak sun hours exposes hands and arms to damaging UV rays.

Sun safety is not just for vacation. Remember to protect yourself and your family!
